<p>Beliefs (Religion, Faith and Teachings)</p> <p>Incarnation Salvation Agape</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Christians believe that the Bible shows how God will treat relationship with people who believe in Him. ✓ Christians believe God as Father, Son (Jesus) and Holy Spirit (one God in 3 persons) and Christians call this the Trinity. ✓ Christians will describe one God as Father (parent), Son (Jesus) and Holy Spirit. The Trinity. ✓ Christians believe in the Trinity. There is one God, but He is three separate people: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is sometimes known as the Holy Ghost. ✓ Recall stories from the Bible of Jesus miracles – what do they say about Jesus? e.g. that Jesus calmed a storm – he had power over the forces of nature Mark 4.35-41, healing Jairus’ daughter – that he had power over death (Luke 8. 40-56). Understand what Christians believe this and other stories from the Bible say about who Jesus is – that only God can do things like this. Christians believe that Jesus is the Son of God. ✓ Understand what it means when the Bible is referred to as God’s word. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Christians try to be like Jesus and try to be his followers. ✓ They will understand that Christians believe that being a Christian involves a relationship with God through Jesus Christ. ✓ Christians believe that ✓ Jesus was the son of God and that he came to Earth to teach people about God’s message. ✓ Recognise that Christian believe Jesus is the Saviour. ✓ Jesus died on a crucifix. ✓ Christians believe that, because Jesus died, they can be forgiven by God. ✓ Christians believe that to save humanity, God had a salvation plan. ✓ The story of Zacchaeus, a tax collector, is about him having no friends and wanting to change his greedy ways. He wanted to give half of his wealth to the poor. ✓ He wanted to listen to Jesus because he wanted to change his life for the better. ✓ In the parable. of the Prodigal Son, the father forgives his son when he returns and welcomes him home. In the same way, God waits for humans to realise what they have done wrong and ask for forgiveness and welcomes them back when they do. ✓ Palm Sunday is the day Jesus entered into Jerusalem. ✓ Judas is one of Jesus’ special friends (disciples) and the important people gave Judas money to tell them where Jesus was. ✓ Jesus had a Passover meal with his friends which is known as the Last Supper. ✓ Jesus knew someone would turn against him. ✓ He went to pray in the Garden of Gethsemane. ✓ Judas identified Jesus and Jesus was arrested. ✓ Another prisoner was freed and the crowd wanted Jesus to be punished. ✓ Jesus had to carry a heavy cross through the streets of Jerusalem. ✓ Jesus died on the cross and his friends and family were very sad. ✓ Jesus’ body was put in a tomb and a large, heavy stone was put across the entrance. ✓ On the third day, Mary and some of his other friends went to the tomb, Jesus was not there and the stone had been rolled away. ✓ An angel told them that Jesus had gone. ✓ Jesus met his friends before going back to Heaven. ✓ The Feeding of the 4,000 shows that Jesus taught his followers that you should love your neighbour as yourself.

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Understand the story of the Good Samaritan helping the Jew as they were enemies. ✓ People should always show kindness even when they can't have it returned. ✓ Agape love is considered the highest form of love which is selfless, and shows unconditional care for others. ✓ Understand that the The Rich Fool (selfishness and greed) and widow's gift meant that she gave everything rather than from her leftovers demonstrating that she out-gave everyone else. She demonstrated loving your neighbour as yourself.
Practices (Worship, Commitment, Rites of Passage and Pilgrimage)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Even though churches and church buildings may be different, they will still baptise, do communion and share passages from the Bible. ✓ Children can recall the basic items such as font and altar. 	
Festivals (Belonging and Celebration).	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Easter and Christmas are important Christian festivals. Christmas celebrates Jesus' birth and Easter celebrates Jesus' death and resurrection. ✓ Christians believe that Jesus died for their sins and that one day he will come again. ✓ A child can be baptised (christened) where a person is welcomed into the Church. ✓ Water is used and the person baptising usually says, "I baptise you in the name of the Father, The Son and the Holy Spirit." 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Holy Week is a special week which encourages Christians to reflect on Lent and their faith before celebrating Easter and how different parts of the Easter story are celebrated by Christians at different points in the week. ✓ Christians believe Jesus came to forgive and rescue everyone. No one is too bad – or too good. ✓ On Good Friday Christians remember when Jesus died on the cross. ✓ Easter Sunday (3 days later) was when he was resurrected. ✓ Lent is a 40 day season of prayer, fasting, and charity that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter. ✓ For many Christians, giving something up for Lent is a helpful way of focusing their thoughts on God.
