They then became pond detectives, using magnifying glasses to carefully observe and identify a range of fascinating pond creatures.

It was a wonderful day filled with hands-on learning, exploration and discovery. The children showed great curiosity, enthusiasm and respect for nature throughout the visit and they all returned to school with smiles on their faces!

Year 4 Explore Geography at Dawlish Warren!



Our Year 4 pupils took their learning outside the classroom earlier this month with an exciting educational trip to Dawlish Warren. The hands-on field trip focused on coastal geography and the changing nature of our coastline.



During the visit, students investigated the powerful effects of coastal erosion and discovered why sea defences are vital to protecting the local environment. They saw geography in action by learning how longshore drift moves material along the coast, shaping unique land formations over time.

The children impressed everyone with their excellent questions and geographic vocabulary. It was a fantastic opportunity for our young scientists to see real-world geographical processes up close!

Year 5 – Mayan Week and Story Teller, Clive Pig

Last week in Year 5 was Mayan Week! To inspire the children's learning, they were delighted to have a visit from storyteller Clive Pig. Mr Pig spoke about Columbus and Amerigo Vespucci, about the Aztecs and the Incas and most of all - about the Mayans! The children heard their creation myths, about gods such as Huracan from whom we get the word hurricane, and how the first eight people were made from corn. Heron and Swan class also learned about the origin of sunflowers, peanuts, marigolds, tomatoes and more! They discovered how the Spanish plundered for gold and silver, were astonished by the Mayans' bouncy balls and heard about the adventures of three brothers as they headed on a journey to the underworld! What a superb start to their thrilling new topic!



During week the children were then fully immersed in all things Mayan, exploring where the Maya people came from and their rich history and all their amazing scientific developments and amazing architecture. The children made comparisons between the Maya civilisation and the Anglo Saxon period here in the UK. They learnt about the Mayan number system, Gods and hierarchy and even had a go at the famous Pok-a-Tok ball game in PE! They finished their week with a Mayan day where they dressed up in Maya costume – all the amazing efforts were astounding! They then designed and made their own Mayan masks. Well done Year 5 – a fabulous topic to end the school year!
