Communication and Language:  Use a stuffed toy who has just returned from a trip. Interview Teddy, asking open-ended questions like "What did you eat at the beach?" or "Did you swim in the ocean?"	Expressive Art and Design: Make your own pirate treasure map. What treasure are you going to find? 	Literacy: Write a fact about your favourite sea creature. 
Maths: We will be learning about measures and sea animals this term. Can you measure out how long a big blue whale is? What other extra-large sea creatures could you measure to see how large they really are?
