

Year 6 Homework

This booklet contains your homework and your deadlines for Year 6. If you think you won't be able to do a task on time, remember to let your teacher know **before** the due date.

Weekend Homework: Knowledge Sheets (tested Mondays) See a video about this at: <https://tinyurl.com/knowledgehomework>

These are **one-page summaries** of the key information for each week's topic. Try to memorise as much as you can with **look, cover and check** method: write down **ten questions** on a sheet of paper. Write the answers on the back. Then fold the sheet over so you can see the questions but not the answers – can you remember the answers to your own questions? The best way to remember is to test yourself after longer and longer periods... after a day, 2 days, 5 days, 2 weeks, 5 weeks etc. Each week, we will pick some of **your** questions for a quiz in class. Based on the example on the left, here are the kinds of questions you could ask yourself:

- Give an example of a microclimate.
- Areas where similar types of plants grow are called...
- Name two types of vegetation that grow in tundra.
- Which climate type is very cold and dry with long, dark winters?

English homework (due Tuesdays)

This will be from the **grammar** books – look at the schedule. **You can write in the grammar books.** **Once you have completed the grammar, check your answers in the back.** If you were not correct and need more help, please fold the corner of the page down before you hand it in so we can quickly see who needs support.

Maths homework: (due Wednesdays)

Check the homework table – if it's in bold and has a page number, it will be from the maths CGP book. Otherwise it will be from papers you are given in class. For CGP book questions involving diagrams, tracing paper will be supplied. Some of you will have slightly different books but it doesn't matter which book you have – the page numbers are the same. ☺ **You can write in the maths books.** **Once you have completed the maths, check your answers in the back.** If you were not correct and need more help, please fold the corner of the page down before you hand it in so we can quickly see who needs support.

Times Table/Arithmetic homework: (due Thursdays)

Use the games on **Times Tables Rockstars** and **Numbots** regularly and practise in your Times Table book using the strategies in the inside cover.

Spelling: (tested Fridays)

These will be given out each week to practise. Copy out the spellings accurately three times using **look, cover, check** to help your memory. Also write five sentences to practise using the words in context. Some spelling strategies are given in the inside cover of your pink spelling book. You should also be practising the year 5-6 words which are listed in the middle of your reading record. Check the website for additional spelling help.

Reading Record (handed in on Mondays for monitoring)

Keep your reading record book up-to-date with what you have read. If you're struggling to find a book that's right for you, speak to an adult in your class or ask a friend for a recommendation.
